



## Las Vegas Township Community Court

Community court uses collaborative problem-solving to respond to community concerns regarding public safety by addressing certain lower level offenses with a more comprehensive approach than a traditional court.

The community court's collaborative model helps participants with complex social needs by providing increased supervision and connection to social services.

The Las Vegas Township's Community Court will address misdemeanor offenses, and participants of community court will engage in an assessment to identify their various needs and risk of reoffending.

To ensure services are quickly and easily accessible to participants, the community court provides an onsite location and warm handoff to service providers. Individuals do not need a citation to access the help center. The court seeks to have a wide range of service options available to meet community members' needs.
